

Travel Information Juneau to Sitka/Sitka to Juneau on MV Westward

General trip information

Your trip will begin in Juneau or Sitka, depending on which departure you are on (check your trip booking to confirm your date and departure port). Travel to/from Juneau or Sitka is usually booked to/from Seattle on Alaska Air (www.alaskaair.com).

You may also choose to use the Alaska Marine Highway System (State Ferry System) which has weekly arrivals from Bellingham, WA and Prince Rupert, B.C. Go to www.alaska.gov/ferry for their schedule and fare information.

We recommend that you arrive a day prior to the cruise departure date to insure that you will not miss the boat.

Finding the MV Westward

<u>Juneau:</u> Westward will be moored in downtown Juneau in the vicinity of the Mount Roberts Tram base station. Please call the boat at 360.298.1661 to verify our moorage site.

<u>Sitka:</u> Westward will be docked in Sitka Harbor. Please call the Sitka Harbor Master at 907.747.3439 to confirm our moorage location.

When to meet the boat

<u>Juneau:</u> We welcome guests aboard at 12:00 noon, hoping to cast off by 12:30 pm. After boarding, we will help you get your luggage into your cabin. Following a safety orientation, we will get underway. After leaving port, we will serve a full lunch and give brief introductions to the workings of the boat and an overview of the voyage ahead.

<u>Sitka</u>: We welcome you aboard at noon. There are several historic sites of significance in Sitka. Take the time to visit a few of them during a walk through the town. Board *Westward* in time for a late lunch, while we cast off. After leaving port, we will give a safety orientation and give brief introductions to the working of the boat and an overview of the voyage ahead.



If you miss the boat

Call our office at 360.378.7123 as soon as it becomes obvious that you will be late. If there is no answer, leave a message. If you cannot leave a return number, call again in one hour. The best way to catch up to the boat is via float plane. Air taxi services are available as follows:

The call sign for the *Westward* is WDD 4133. Your pilot will need our call sign to contact the boat. If your luggage is delayed, it can be delivered to the boat. Speak to the Captain, and he will help you in arranging this.

Journey's end

<u>Juneau:</u> We will arrive at the dock in Juneau in time for you to catch the early afternoon southbound flights.

<u>Sitka:</u> We will arrive at the dock in Sitka in the early morning, leaving plenty of time to visit several historic sites of significance here.

It is worth spending an extra day or two in Juneau or Sitka (or both). Use the suggestions below to plan your stay before and after the trip.

Take the tram ride to the top of Mt. Roberts, hike around and/or visit the Alaska State museum. Take a helicopter ride to the top of a glacier or book a dogsled tour with Coastal Helicopters (www.coastalhelicopters.com); or book a Taku Glacier Lodge Flight & Feast (www.wingsairways.com) three hours total with approximately 40-50 min of flight time over the Juneau ice field, land on Taku River and take a salmon dinner at the historic Taku Glacier Lodge.

Purchase fishing licenses for Alaska online at http://www.admin.adfg.state.ak.us/license. Fishing is dependent on activities and tides. Our fishing is limited to stream fishing for salmon and trout, setting crab/prawn traps, and casting with light poles off the boat. If you would like an opportunity to fish for halibut and salmon, we suggest extending your visit and take a full or half day trip with a local guide.
